Parade of Significance

On a sunny Sunday morning on 9th November our cadets participated in the Christchurch NZCF Parade of Significance and Remembrance service. Along with the other cadet units from Christchurch and members of the RSA and accompanied by the NZ Army Band they marched from outside Christ's College to the Park of Remembrance to commemorate Armistice Day.

Parades were held across the nation with a special parade in Wellington that included 150 cadets made up of representatives from every cadet unit in the country to mark 150 years of Cadet Forces in New Zealand. 17th Squadron's representative in Wellington was Flight Sergeant Saville.

Flight Simulator
