In our last issue we congratulated WO Amy Vallance on her selection as the South Island ATC cadet for the inaugural Cadet of the Year competition to be held at RNZAF Base Ohakea. We are delighted to announce that, not only did she compete well, she won the competition to become Top Cadet of the Year.

This was no easy feat as she was up against the top cadets from all three cadet corps (Air, Navy and Army) from both the North and the South

Islands and was also competing alongside the top reservists from the territorial forces.

The competitors were tested on various components including Speeches, General Service Knowledge, First Aid (with the use of amputees to make it more realistic), PT (physical training), Shooting, Masterchef using ration packs, Concentration and Memory Recall and something called an Observation Gallery involving a helicopter crash. Amy came first in many of these challenges and was in the top three in the others. She can be justifiably proud of a very well-deserved win!
