Who are the USC

A little background into the Unit Support Committee that you may not be aware of: it was written into the constitution of Cadet Forces in the 1970's, that each Air Cadet Unit is required to have a Unit Support Committee. That USC is the local branch of the Air Training Corps Association of New Zealand (ATCANZ). This came about from when Cadets were funded fully by the Defence Forces, to be partially funded and required each Unit to source their own funding. This is the primary role of the USC, as well as providing support and infrastructure to their Unit. The USC is traditionally made up of parents of present or past cadets, former cadets, members from the Defence Force, RSA or interested parties. So therefore, without a USC, a Unit cannot exist. Conversely, without a Unit, a USC is not necessary. So, it is very important to have an enthusiastic and organized USC, as well as a healthy working relationship with the Unit Commander and Unit.

ATCANZ National Council Meeting 2022 summary

The ATCANZ AGM was held in Wellington on 28th May, which differed

from the usual venue of RNZAF Base Ohakea, due to restrictions of non-Defence Force personal on Base.

17 Squadron Branch USC was represented by Neville Warsaw, Darryl Cotton [and Neil Wech, as his role as ATCANZ Vice President and 17 Branch Secretary].

There were some very informative and interesting presentations from the ATCANZ President, Presidents of the Cadet Corp [army] and Sea Cadets, President of the RSA, Commandant of Cadet Forces – Commander Mark Henderson and Chief of Air Force – Air Vice- Marshall Andrew Clark.

As there were no nominations for new committee or officers for the Management committee and the incumbents willing to stay on, there was no need for the election process. While we are fortunate to have the historic experience and contacts in the Cadet and Defence forces of our longstanding Officers in the Management Committee, it is great to have several members that are also current Branch Unit Support Committee members as well. This is very important to keep a current viewpoint on what is happening at the coal face at Unit and Branch level and not just add another layer of bureaucracy.

The Sainsbury Award funding of around \$9000 was distributed between 7, 27,88 and 15 Squadrons. This funding is likely to increase to up to \$14,000 in coming years with a change in investment and administration costs.

The financial statements were read and discussed, with the main concern expressed with the late lodgement of end of year financials of many Branches. Also of a concern, was the information required from the Branches by the Management Committee for auditing for the Charities Commission, was not accurate. This required extra work from Tristan Wills, the ATCANZ accountant, although it was a marked improvement on previous years. 17 Branch has received some criticism in the past from using our own Xero account and not the shared ATCANZ one. But it was pleasing and notable to hear from the accountant that the hard work of Neville to work in with Tristan to align the coding and inputs has made it pretty seamless to do the annual accounts. 17 Branch was mentioned several times as a model Branch with our financial reporting, so our appreciation goes out to Neville.

General business revealed some interesting discussions. Succession planning for Branch and Management Committees uncovered that most of the Branches struggled with this and there seems to be a large gap between committee members that stay on for years after their children finish in the Unit and new committee members that may only come on board for a couple of years. Certainly something 17 Branch need to discuss. An email address system for the Officers of each Branch, rather than using personal email address was discussed and everybody agreed this was a great idea. The email address would be handed on to newly elected Officers, so the email history wouldn't be lost and enable Branch's to communicate easier between each other and the Management Committee.

Finally, the address from Chief of Air Force was quite insightful and revealed a testing time of the last Covid influenced year. The Air Force used between 1200-1500 personnel manning MIQ facilities, which meant training; exercises and recruitment were well behind schedule. The attrition rate within the Air Force dropped to a low 4% over the last couple of years, but is now up to 10%, which reinforced the need to recruit new personnel. Part of this process is to attract more females, with reaching their target of 20% in 2020, to meet the target of 25% by 2025. Operational wise, the Air Force assisted with operations and aid for the Tongan Volcano disaster, Mid Canterbury Floods and the first for the

RNZAF, a medical evacuation from Antarctica during the winter with a C130 Hercules, with the flight crew using night vision equipment. The Orion surveillance aircraft are being phased out and replaced with the Boeing P8 over the next couple of years. The current C130 Hercules aircraft are also being phased out, with a replacement of the new generation Hercules C130J happening over the next 2 years also.

So overall, I found the day very informative and as this was my first participation in the Nation Council AGM, was a great way to gain more understanding on how the ATCANZ organization works, put some faces to names and network with other Branch committee members.
